#### Adult Outpatient Treatment

Provides substance abuse outpatient treatment to adults ages 18 and above with a diagnosis of substance abuse and/or dependence. The program offers both individual and/or group counseling sessions on a weekly basis.

#### Alcohol Education Program for Minors

Provides six (6) hours of education to individuals 20 and younger that have been cited for possessing, purchasing, or consuming alcoholic beverages.
